Professor Cédric Villani

Cédric Villani is a professor of mathematics at Université de Lyon and the director of Institut Henri Poincaré in Paris.

In 2010, Villani was awarded the Fields Medal for his proofs of nonlinear Landau damping and convergence to equilibrium for the Boltzmann equation. His other honors and awards include the Fermat Prize, the Henri Poincaré Prize of the International Association of Mathematical Physics, the Prize of the European Mathematical Society and the Jacques Herbrand Prize of the French Academy of Sciences.
