Carsten Thomassen and Richard Wilson both have very short ancestry. Carsten Thomassen's advisor was Daniel Younger whose advisor is unknown. Richard Wilson's advisor was Dwijendra Ray-Chaudhuri whose advisor was Raj Bose. Bose got his degree in India from Calcutta University but his advisor is unknown. The Genealogy Project lists 16 students for Rick Wilson and the first name on that list is Shahin Ajoodani-Namini, a name well known at IPM.

Willem Haemers' mathematical father is the well known Johan Jacob Seidel. The other names in his ancestry are: Johannes Haantjes, Willem van der Woude, Jan Schouten, Pieter Schoute, David Bierens de Haan, and J. Cardinaal. Remarkably they are all from the Netherlands.
